# "Hypocrite(s)(ical)" as found in the OT of the KJV.

*Ḥānēp*, Hebrew Strong's #2611, is an adjective translated as "hypocrite" 13 times. It is from the root word (Strong's #2610) that means profane, defile, corrupt, pollute.

# Job 13:16 -

He also *shall be* my salvation: for an <u>hypocrite</u> shall not come before him.

### Job 15:34 -

For the congregation of <u>hypocrites</u> shall be desolate, and fire shall consume the tabernacles of bribery.

### Job 17:8 -

Upright *men* shall be astonied at this, and the innocent shall stir up himself against the <u>hypocrite</u>.

# Job 20:5 -

That the triumphing of the wicked is short, and the joy of the <u>hypocrite</u> but for a moment?

### Job 27:8 -

For what is the hope of the hypocrite, though he hath gained, when God taketh away his soul?

#### Job 34:30 -

That the <u>hypocrite</u> reign not, lest the people be ensnared.

# Job 36:13 -

But the hypocrites in heart heap up wrath: they cry not when he bindeth them.

### Psalm 35:16 -

With <u>hypocritical</u> mockers in feasts, they gnashed upon me with their teeth.

# Proverbs 11:9 -

An <u>hypocrite</u> with *his* mouth destroyeth his neighbour: but through knowledge shall the just be delivered.

# Isaiah 9:17 -

Therefore the Lord shall have no joy in their young men, neither shall have mercy on their fatherless and widows: for every one *is* an <u>hypocrite</u> and an evildoer, and every mouth speaketh folly. For all this his anger is not turned away, but his hand *is* stretched out still.

# Isaiah 10:6 -

I will send him against an <u>hypocritical</u> nation, and against the people of my wrath will I give him a charge, to take the spoil, and to take the prey, and to tread them down like the mire of the streets.

# Isaiah 33:14 -

The sinners in Zion are afraid; fearfulness hath surprised the <u>hypocrites</u>. Who among us shall dwell with the devouring fire? who among us shall dwell with everlasting burnings?

*Ḥōnep*, Hebrew Strong's #2612, is a noun translated as "hypocrisy" 1 time. It is also from the root meaning filth and wickedness.

# Isaiah 32:6 -

For the vile person will speak villany, and his heart will work iniquity, to practise <u>hypocrisy</u>, and to utter error against the LORD, to make empty the soul of the hungry, and he will cause the drink of the thirsty to fail.
